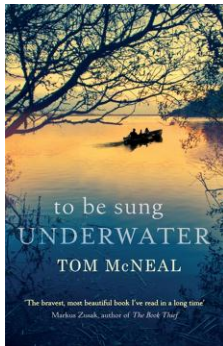

Judith, TV editor, wife and mother has just two secrets, but they are about to come together in a way that threatens to dismantle her whole carefully planned life.

First, there is Willy, the sweet and funny boy with whom she had a passionate summer romance before going away to college, and whom she promised to marry. And two decades later there is Edie Winks, the false identity she chooses when she rents a space to store the vestiges of her teenage life.

While on the surface her adult life seems perfect, she suspects her husband is unfaithful, and she's troubled by the way her daughter is growing up. As her world unravels, Judith uses Edie as a way of going back to her past, both to find Willy and the girl she was.

McNeal's study of a girl in love and of a woman trying to find her way is beautifully written, taking on the question "what if" in an intriguing way.

Some won't like the ending, but the journey there is nothing less than wonderful.
