



Proposed Albany Highway Speed Zone Change

FAQs INFORMATION SHEET

What is the proposed reduction in speed?

Currently the speed limit along Albany Highway in this area is 50km/hr. It is proposed that the speed limit should be reduced to 40km/hr.

Why is the reduction in speed being proposed?

The proposed speed zoning change is designed to provide a safer and more formalised environment for pedestrians, residents, patrons, motorists and other road users who require access to the many business, cafes, shops, restaurants, and other properties situated along Albany Highway.

What is the cost to the Town/ratepayers?

The cost is borne by Main Roads WA. There is no cost to the Town of Victoria Park in terms of the actual re-zoning process if it is approved to go ahead.

If successful, when will the change be implemented?

Following community consultation feedback, if the recommendation made to Council is supported and approved, it is envisaged that the speed zone change will be completed within the current financial year, subject to Main Roads' works program.

Where does the change start and finish?

The change will commence from the intersection of Armagh Street and Albany Highway in Victoria Park and continue through to the Welshpool/Shepperton Roads and Albany Highway intersection in St James. This is an approximate distance of four (4) kilometres.
