## **TOWN OF VICTORIA PARK TIME LINE**

The Town of Victoria Park is a local government authority situated immediately to the south east of central Perth, the capital city of Western Australia. It is an inner-urban residential area, with some peripheral industries that experienced most of its initial growth during the first half of the Twentieth Century. Since then there has been considerable redevelopment of the housing stock, commercial and industrial areas.

The Victoria Park local government area was established in 1894 but in 1917 was absorbed into the Perth City Council. However, in 1994 that authority was restructured into four autonomous councils and Victoria Park again became an independent municipality and has closely resumed its original boundaries.

The Municipality is comprised of five main suburbs: Victoria Park, East Victoria Park, Lathlain, Carlisle and Burswood as well as sections of suburbs from surrounding localities including: Rivervale, Welshpool, Bentley and St. James. As at May 2007 the Town is governed by Mayor J.A. (Mick) Lee, and councillors: David Ashton, Keith Hayes, Jan Mason, Vin Nairn, Rowena Skinner, Bruce Stevenson (Deputy Mayor), and Trevor Vaughan. The administration is located at 99 Shepperton Road, Victoria Park, WA 6100 and the Chief Executive Officer is Mr John Bonker.

It will be noticed that there are some references to nearby places beyond the geographic boundary of the Town of Victoria Park. These, particularly those relating to schools and churches, are included because they have been significant to a substantial number of the municipality's residents.

The development of this time line is an on-going project and in this edition an endeavour has been made to 'fill out' the period of the first Council, that is from 1894 to 1917.
